

The Greater Calumet Area USBC will again offer one-time scholarship opportunities to boys and girls graduating high school this year.

Funded by a gift by the GCA Board of Directors and by funds raised in the annual scholarship golf outing in July, the GCA has awarded more than 30 one-time scholarships to deserving boys and girls since 1997. Winning students in 2011 shared \$1,500.

To be eligible, boys and girls must have a grade point average of 3.0 or more and be a member of a GCA bowling center's youth program. Illinois high school bowlers, who are not eligible to bowl in youth leagues, qualify if their home center is in Lynwood, Lansing or Calumet City.

Deadline for submitting the scholarship application is June 15.
